Our Union – an Update on the Legal Issues

Since the last issue of this newsletter there have been two important developments.

First, there was a meeting between our Session Clerks and the Presbytery Clerk and the Convener of Presbytery's Deployment Committee. This clarified a number of issues associated with our move to union. We now have clarity on our Basis of Union as well as the steps needed to end the linkage between Craigmillar Park and Reid Memorial Churches. We also have a much better understanding of the arrangements for our Team Ministry and how our two ministers will work together. It looks too as if the various permissions for the sale of the Craigmillar Park building will soon be in place, allowing us to proceed.

The second development is that representatives from a sub-group of Presbytery's Deployment Committee will meet with the Ministers and Kirk Sessions of Craigmillar Park and Priestfield (and all Reviewable Charges) during the early part of 2024. In light of the agreed Presbytery Plan, from April 2023, they will discuss our Reviewable Charges and how this ministry may continue once the Presbytery Plan is implemented.

Getting Together

We are now enjoying shared services on the third Sunday of each month till the end of the year. These will again be in our future base, the existing Mayfield Salisbury church building. After careful consideration changes are being made to ensure that we can all meet afterwards and chat over a coffee. We are also looking at how we can better accommodate the increasing number of us with wheelchairs and walking aids.

We are in the final stages of working out how our three Kirk Sessions can meet as one, even prior to Union. We hope to make these changes early in the new year.

Coming Together Step by Step

As the groups conclude their work there will be periodic reports to our three Kirk Sessions.

Some of the changes will be able to be implemented immediately, others will be in preparation for 'Union-Day.' Together they will set the pattern for our congregational life together in future years.
