Gift Day

As for all churches, 2020 is proving a difficult year financially for Priestfield. Even before the COVID pandemic hit, we had been looking at a deficit for the year of around £20,000 unless a sizeable amount could be raised from a Gift Day.

We are exceedingly grateful to all of you who have been able to continue with your usual level of weekly or monthly giving to the work of God in our church. However, with the church building closed for so many months, our income from the external groups who share our premises has been very significantly depleted. We have "core" monthly costs of around £7,000 per month whether the building is open or closed. The outcome is that without a Gift Day, we would now be expecting a deficit of closer to £25,000.

The Kirk Session has therefore agreed that **a Gift Day will be held on 1 November.**

Gifts including cash or cheques (made out to Priestfield Parish Church) can be brought to church in an envelope marked "Gift Day", if you plan to attend that morning. If you are part of the Gift Aid scheme, please remember to include your name with your gift so that we can claim back tax from the government. Alternatively, donations can be made directly to the church bank account, referenced "Gift Day".
